FMA has surpassed a decade and a half of providing inspiration, education, assistance, and music while surpassing 1,000 members world-wide. Nearly half being student musicians with a huge passion for aviation.

John Zapp, FMA President/CEO, recalls, "FMA was embraced by the aviation community from day one. AOPA was our first corporate member. At their request, we developed a corporate membership. Almost immediately, the music community came on board. We were selected to be a NAMM (National Association of Music Merchants) Foundation partner, affording us unfettered access to music merchants across the globe. Now you will see FMA representatives at both The NAMM Show in Anaheim, CA and Summer NAMM in Nashville in addition to aviation events like AirVenture and Sun 'n Fun."

The Flying Musicians Association's unique learn to fly program/scholarship "FMA Solo" was created 10 years ago with the assistance of Tim Kern. The program has seen exponential growth in the last few years, nearly tripling the nominations from music directors. These students are the best of the best academically and musically while also exhibiting exceptional citizenship skills. As they further mature, their influence on underclassmen will no doubt leave a positive and lasting influence on the aviation and music communities. FMA student members are our future leaders.

There have been two impressive new developments in the past 5 years. First was the establishment of a music scholarship to *New York Hot Jazz Camp* - **Swing Wing scholarship.**Then the **FMA Mentor's Ramp** was recently developed to welcome and nurture new student members in both their aviation and music pursuits. The idea was conceived by former scholarship recipient, Jacob Burdette. Jacob was one of two scholarship recipients in 2020 and has since graduated from Kent State with a degree in professional aviation. The initial mentors consisted of past scholarship recipients but now all members are jumping onboard. What a great way to give back.


