The FMA Solo program was established by pilots who are musicians, spanning the globe, proficiency levels, and all musical genres. The skills required to play an instrument and fly an aircraft have marked similarities, from precision and multitasking to listening and fine motor skills. By pointing out and building on these common attributes, we hope to further interest in both aviation and music. Members share their passions in order to inspire, educate, encourage, and assist others by creating enthusiasm while promoting personal growth through aviation and music.

Musician: A person who writes, sings, or plays music.

There are many pilot/musicians around the world. Some are famous: Dierks Bentley and Kenny G. Many, and Aaron Tippin are accomplished and at the top of their profession: Louis Vickerman - principal harpist with the Utah Symphony, Jay Mason – professional studio musician, ATP pilot, music and aviation educator, and Ted Piltzecker - world class vibraphonist, composer, performer and educator. The attributes of concentration, practice, crew and resource management, and precision in performances are traits essential in music, and particularly in a group of musicians. They lead to success in many areas of life, but none more so than in flying an aircraft. Not surprisingly, airline studies have indicated that piloting an aircraft has much in common with a musical performance.

FMA hopes to expand the horizons of students who have been taught the right-stuff through their music training while encouraging them to continue music for life.

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FMA SOLO Program Guidelines

The Flying Musicians Solo program is more than the scholarships awarded to a high school junior or senior musician in good standing, nominated by their music director, but is also an introduction to all nominees into the FMA network - A network consisting of like-minded individuals who will be valuable assets throughout life. The scholarship award sponsors the student through their first solo in flight training with an FAA certified flight instructor. FMA will assist with training material and flight gear with the help of corporate members and sponsors when able. All nominees will receive a student membership, FMA shirt, swag, and will be offered a Youth ambassador position with opportunities to represent FMA at events.

Deadline:

- 1. Nominations Due January 31, 2025
- 2. Finalists Notified March 1, 2025
- 3. Finalists Acceptance Due March 31, 2025
- 4. Awards Announced and Recipients Notified May 1, 2025

Criteria:

- 1. High school junior or senior music student in good standing.
- 2. Student must be nominated by his/her music instructor.
- 3. Minimum of 16 years old (by March 31, 2025)
- 4. Proof of Citizenship (in the country of training)
- 5. For USA applicants: Able to obtain a 3rd Class FAA Medical Exam, State Issued Driver license or equivalent and or required in country of training
- 6. For Canadian applicants: Able to obtain a Category 3 Aviation Medical
- 7. Parental Approval if under 18 years of age

How to Nominate:

- 1. Fill out the attached nomination form
- 2. Include Basic information:
 - a. School
 - b. Yourself (Music Instructor)
 - c. Nominee
- 3. Write a paragraph about the nominee.
